What is Navigator?

Michigan CTE Navigator is an electronic system that provides real-time access to Michigan's state approved CTE program curriculum. This system will be useful to districts and educators for educational decision-making, management, and ultimately student achievement. The web-based, online database is comprehensive, statewide, user-friendly, and instructor-driven and can be used for managing the technical standards, career cluster content, segments, resource content, and academic alignment results for all of Michigan's CTE program areas.

The website is up and ready to be used (<http://navigator.mccte-fsu.org>). All CEPD administrators received an email on August 18, 2009 requesting them to go into NAVIGATOR and check their profile information and activate the CTE administrators/building administrators for their area. CEPD administrators are the ones who start the registration process. The plan was to have all CEPD administrators, CTE administrators/building administrators, CTE teachers, and curriculum consultants in the system by the end of August. Many are set up in the system and are already using it.

Tutorials/resources will be going up soon to assist teachers with using the system. They will all be located on the homepage under "How to Use Navigator". The tutorials/resources will be: How to retrieve a password, how to activate a teacher, how to use Navigator, how to Upload and Retrieve Delivery Resources, and how to Customize Academic Alignment by PSN.

Academic Alignment Progress

At this time, we have completed academic alignment with **37** CTE instructional programs (CIPs), **30** of which have completed two alignments. We have **30** with math alignment, **24** with ELA alignment, and **15** with science alignment. We thank all of the CTE and academic teachers who assisted with the state panels. To view a listing of the CIPs that have been completed and which academic area was aligned go to MCCTE-FSU.org website. MCCTE-FSU and MDE Standards Review and Revision Process

The MCCTE-FSU and MDE Standards Revision Process represents an essential step toward ensuring that all students are prepared for the demands of today's workforce and that they have the knowledge and skills to be successful in the workforce and/or future educational opportunities. The CTE Instructional Program Standards Review and Revision Process described below is designed to provide a systematic process for insuring continuous improvement of the Michigan CTE technical standards. The goals of the CTE Instructional Program Standards Review and Revision Process will be to:

- assess the proposed new set of CIP technical standards for the current workforce needs
- assess the completeness of, and revise as needed, the CIP technical standards
- evaluate the appropriateness of, and revise as needed, the segment titles and allocated content
- validate, and revise as needed, the state academic alignment document
- make a recommendation regarding the current or new standards that have been reviewed

In February, we piloted the review and revision process with 12.1999 Marketing, Sales and Service and 47.0604 Automotive Technician. The CTE instructional programs that will be done this year are identified in the cluster sections of this brief. We now need to identify our participants (secondary and postsecondary teachers, as well as contacts in business and industry) and need your assistance to do this. Teacher Academy—August 4-5, 2009

In August, OCTE conducted a two day workshop for CTE teachers. The goals were for the teachers to identify strategies for implementing the Michigan CTE Standards and network with CTE teachers from around the state.

Each of the CTE Instructional Programs identified what they felt were the power standards for each segment, then they identified delivery resources for those standards. Personnel Skilled in Technology

Reporting of Technology for our schools, staff members, and students has changed and you need to be aware of the changes. The U.S. has made it mandatory for the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) to collect four data elements on educational technology in the classroom based on the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). The areas include: Personnel Skilled in Technology (assessment by the district of personnel in their use of technology), Integrated Technology Status (District Technology Plan), Instructional Computers (number of computers in the building and the Internet connectivity); and 8th Grade Technology (certify the number of students who you have assessed and the number of students deemed technology literate). 47.0604—Automotive Technician
